Types of Scholarships

- College of Engineering granted 435 awards totaling more than \$1.6 Million.
- Awarded by the College of Engineering, departments, private donors, departments
- Freshmen-Senior levels
- Merit & Need-based available
- Vary from \$500-cost of tuition
- Apply-to, auto, deadlines vary!

Personal Statement

- "I have always loved math & science and like taking things apart and playing with Legos"-every engineering student ever
- Goal: To have the reviewer know more about you & what makes you different.
 - Why you want to be an engineer?
 - Goals post-graduation
 - Outside involvement
 - Service experiences
 - Research performed outside of class
 - Outreach performed
 - Community involvement
 - Any other things you have done to support your learning experiences
 - If you don't have a lot of involvement, address why & how scholarship money will assist you in becoming involved
 - Should be about a page long (500 words)



Essays

- About 10% of Price College of Engineering scholarships require an additional essay
- Hint: These are the scholarships that are applied for less often
- To view, visit the Price College of Engineering Scholarship page
- Differs from the personal statement because there is a more specific writing prompt
- Do not use your personal statement for these essays

Resumes

- Update it & make it relevant
 - Professional work experience
 - Extracurricular activities
 - Academic projects
 - Awards
 - Research
- <u>U Career Success</u> office has drop-in hours Monday-Thursday 9 AM-2 PM



References

- 2 academic references from STEM-related backgrounds
- Do not use high school teachers or family members
- Cultivate relationships with professors, even if it's just attending office hours
- Provide them with a resume
- Find out what e-mail is best to use for your references
- Follow up with the references to make sure they are turned in by the Feb. 1 deadline
- ASK PERMISSION FIRST
- Don't copy and paste email addresses into email box hand key

Tips and Tricks

- Upload only PDFs
- BS/MS students that will move into the MS portion of their degree next semester should contact their department to see if they are eligible
- Due Feb 1:No exceptions
- The General Application you completed will be on file until August of each year. You must complete a new General Application at the beginning of every fall semester.
- Don't use Internet Explorer!
- The application will close at 11:59pm on Saturday, February 1, 2024.
